### NSTRUCTIONS TO FOLLOW

even without contact (e.g. when casting)

Familiarise yourself with high-risk areas by consulting with your fishing federation.
If you do not know the area well, explore it in the daytime before fishing there.
Avoid fishing near power lines, even if you are fishing from a boat.
Avoid passing underneath power lines with

a fishing rod.
Hold your rod horizontally when you have no choice but to pass underneath a power line.
Never try to retrieve any object stuck on a line.

lf you are an angler...

If you fish too close to a power line, you could cause an electric arc (or arc discharge) and risk being electrocuted.

The years are passing by, each one decidedly different from the last. Having seen repeated droughts and the chronic, recurrent pollution of our waterways, now, anglers are forced to deal with Covid-19, a virus that is ravaging our region, our country and indeed the whole world in an unprecedented, catastrophic turn of events. Everyone is affected by the consequences of this pandemic to some degree, but I would like

those who have been directly hit by the virus to know they are in my thoughts. This extraordinary situation has led governments to take the necessary measures to protect the population, which, of course, have taken their toll on anglers. Due to various lockdowns, we have not been able to get out and enjoy our hobby as much as we would like. I can understand the annoyance and disappointment felt by many, though, as we know, there are much worse things going on at the moment.

During the first lockdown, I contacted various elected officials and heads of government bodies to try to get the ball rolling so that fishing could start again swiftly. In the second, fishing was allowed with a minimum distance of one kilometre and a maximum duration of an hour. I asked the Prefect to relax these measures, as it seemed obvious to me that a lone angler at the river's edge posed much less of a risk than all the people gathered at the supermarket and elsewhere.

To my surprise, his reply, backed up by a ministerial note, prohibited fishing entirely. In response, local federations and the National Federation of Fishing in France appealed for a change to this directive, which was highly unfair in comparison to how other nature 'users' were treated, and I passed this on to our representatives in government. Eventually, the measure was relaxed.

All in all, this has been a difficult year for our organisation, but our board members and associates have played their part and fulfilled practically all of our commitments to our partners. I would like to congratulate and thank them for their work.

Now, the roll-out of an effective vaccine against Covid-19 has finally brought us hope and allowed us to see an end to this situation that has been so damaging for all of us. I hope the difficult times left to come with this virus go by without incident for you all, and I would like to sincerely wish you a happy new year, or at least a much better one than the last.



## Fishing regulations 202

Angling in the department of Doubs is subject to specific regulations, depending on the waterway on which it is carried out.

There are essentially three main classes:

•Private category 1 waterways. Example: Cusancin, Dessoubre, Haut Doubs, Loue..

•Private category 2 waterways. Example: Doubs moyen, Ognon, Savoureuse... •Public category 2 waterways and canals. Example: Doubs inférieur, canal du Rhône au Rhin..

#### And three specific cases:

•A public category 1 section on the Loue River (Arc-et-Senans section). •2 state-owned category 2 hydroelectric reservoirs ('classed as public' as far as

fishing is concerned): Vaufrey and Poset lakes.

•A section governed by an international convention (the Doubs department marks the border with Switzerland between Villers-le-Lac and Clairbief and upstream from Bremoncourt): there are specific fishing regulations in force in this section, which are not described here. For more information, please contact your local AAPPMA (Authorised Fishing and Aquatic Ecosystem Protection Association - (Villers-le-Lac, Grand'Combe-des-Bois, Goumois, St-Hippolyte), or go to the Regulations section of the Federation's website.

You must therefore seek information from the local AAPPMA officials, from fishing licence agents or from the Federation every time you wish to fish in a section you are unfamiliar with.

The following information is a summary of the main texts in existence, taken from the French Environmental Code and the Permanent Regulatory Order concerning freshwater fishing in the department of Doubs.

#### Fishing conduct and methods

### In category 1,

### members of an AAPPMA can fish using:

•1 line in private waters ·2 lines in public waters (Arc-et-Senans section of the Loue River

•1 glass jug or bottle with a maximum capacity of 2 litres to catch minnows and other fish to use as bait

•6 drop nets, with a maximum diameter or diagonal measurement of 30 cm, with 27 mm or 10 mm mesh for catching signal crayfish. The lines must be fitted onto rods and equipped with two

hooks or three artificial flies at most. In category 2,

#### members of an AAPPMA can fish using:

•4 lines in private waters •4 lines in public waters

•1 glass jug or bottle with a maximum capacity of 2 litres to catch minnows and other fish to use as bait

·6 drop nets, with a maximum diameter or diagonal measurement of 30 cm, with 27 mm or 10 mm mesh for catching signal crayfish.

The lines must be fitted onto rods and equipped with two hooks or three artificial flies at most. However, in the Saint-Point, Remoray and Bouverans lakes, the maximum number of hooks per line is set at 10, with a limit of 20 in total for all the lines being used for fishing at one time.

#### Specific measures

#### In both categories, the following is forbidden:

· Fishing under the ice.

• Stirring up the water to fish, except in the case of gudgeon fishing. • Trolling. However, in the Saint-Point and Remoray lakes, trolling with a maximum of 3 lines is allowed on rowing boats only.

• Using the following as bait: fish roe of any kind or origin, species with a legal catching size (even if the bait is this size or larger), and species not detailed on the list of officially present species in the waters subject to the freshwater fishing policy.

• Releasing the following species, transporting them live or using them as bait: catfish, pumpkinseed, pseudorasbora, spinycheek crayfish, signal crayfish, Louisiana crayfish, or Chinese mitten crab (only the catfish may be released where it was caught)

• Keeping a fish not caught by the mouth (unless caught in a jug or a bottle).

#### In category 1,

· Attaching hooks above the sinker is forbidden.

· From the 2nd Saturday in March until the Friday before the 3rd Saturday in May, fly fishing is only allowed with a fly rod and a single barbless hook on the following waterways or sections of waterways: The Loue River and its tributaries, Dessoubre and its tributaries, Cusancin and its tributaries.

From the 3rd Saturday in May (start of the grayling season), fly fishing is allowed to take place there using all methods authorised by general regulations (3 fly lures at most, float, etc.), as in the rest of the department.

•To protect salmonid reproduction, entering the water is forbidden from the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday in March until 30 April. This prohibition is extended to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday in May in the following waterways or sections of waterways (grayling protection): The Loue River and its tributaries, Dessoubre and its tributaries, Cusancin and its tributaries. • Using cheese, maggots or other insect larvae as bait is forbidden.

#### In category 2:

During the period when pike fishing is forbidden, fishing with live bait, dead bait, artificial bait, a spoon lure or another lure that may catch a pike non-accidentally (all artificial lures, like streamers, or wobbled natural baits, like worms) is forbidden. However, this prohibition only applies from the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday in March to the Doubs River between Moulin de Glère (boundary between category 1 and 2) and the D438 bridge at Voujeaucourt.

#### Fish consumption

Following evidence of all or some species present in certain stretches of river being contaminated with certain pollutants (especially PCB), the consumption of fish (of all species) is forbidden in the following sections:

- Ognon, from the Montferney dam to the Montbozon dam.
- Allan, along its entire course. - Savoureuse, along its entire course in the department.
- -Lizaine, along its entire course in the department.

The canals and lakes deriving from the aforementioned waterways are subject to the same measures. Tributaries are not affected. These restrictions do not apply to authorised fishing.

### **Responsibility and respect for others**

· Reserves protected by a prefectoral order.

Anglers are responsible for any damage they cause to property or crops.

You are advised to follow the path for anglers along the river, and not to wander in all directions. Please respect fences and trees, and avoid parking inappropriately.

Look after nature by taking all litter with you, including picnic leftovers, packaging, bait, used fishing line, etc.

Our right to fish, granted by the public and private owners of the waters, depends on your conduct. Just one poorly behaved angler can cause an AAPPMA to lose miles of river.



specific regulations for the Loue, Dessoubre and Cusancin basins

Due to episodes of salmonid death in recent years, the following measures apply in 2021:

- Maximum of 2 river trout per day and catch and release for European grayling in the Dessoubre River (including tributaries and sub-tributaries). Barbless hooks or hooks with a crushed barb for fishing with an artificial fly or natural bait (except minnows)

- Maximum of 2 river trout per day and catch and release for European grayling in the Cusancin River (including tributaries and sub-tributaries, except for Audeux upstream from the resurgence of the Sesserant River at Bléfond). Fishing (all methods) is only allowed with barbless hooks or hooks with a crushed barb. - Catch and release for river trout and European grayling in the Loue River (including tributaries and sub-tributaries). Fishing (all methods) is only allowed with barbless hooks or hooks with a crushed barb.

\*In category 1, any pike caught between 13 March and 23 April must be released back into the water immediately. This rule is extended to 4 June in all sections classed as category 1 on the Doubs, its tributaries and its sub-tributaries, upstream of Chaillexon Lake

\*\*Haut-Doubs: The Doubs and its tributaries classed as category 2, including lakes, upstream of Chaillexon Lake: The Doubs from the Labergement-Sainte-Marie bridge to the Oye-et-Pallet dam (including Saint-Point Lake) and from the La Roche bridge to Chaillexon Lake (boundary with the Doubs along the international border), Remoray Lake and its outlet channel, La Taverne, and Raie du Lotaud (including the Frasne and Pont Rouge lakes).

Please note: The Doubs that runs along the international border (from Chaillexon Lake to Clairbief) is subject to specific regulations (international convention). For further information, please contact your local AAPPMA. (Villers-le-Lac, Grand'Combe-des-Bois, Goumois, St-Hippolyte).

## Fishing times 2021

Fishing is forbidden more than half an hour before sunrise and more than half an hour after sunset. However, there are category 2 sections all over the department where carp fishing can take place at any time, subject to certain conditions: these are the so-called 'Night-Time Carp Fishing' areas (see table), on which 'catch and release' is mandatory and only plant-based baits (boilies, seeds, etc.) are allowed. Please remember that outside the usual hours, keeping a live carp is forbidden. Any carp caught at night must be released immediatel
